

LIVING ON CAMPUS: SOMETHING TO WRITE HOME ABOUT

The Residence Life office is committed to making life on campus a comfortable, fun experience and one that complements the academic mission of the College. The staff is dedicated to developing each resident's abilities and creating a warm, friendly environment. Living on campus gives you an understanding of diverse cultures, enhances your classroom learning, and helps you make lifelong friendships. First year students live in one of two residence halls: Brubacher Hall or Lima Hall. Upperclass students can choose to live in suite-style townhouses, Victorian-style houses accommodating 6 to 42 students, or Senior Apartments. Living on-campus gives you quick and easy access to many of the major campus buildings including classrooms and the dining hall, which are right outside your door. *Starbucks, CVS, Price Chopper* and *Dunkin' Donuts* are also just a guick walk away.







BRUBACHER HALL



Located up the street from the Saint Rose Events and Athletics Center, Brubacher Hall is a coeducational living environment and houses over 300 first-year resident students. The building has everything you need right inside: a computer lab, study and social lounges and even a café in the basement.

LIMA HALL

Lima Hall is a modern coeducational living environment housing over 200 first-year resident students. An elevator makes the building fully accessible. Study and social lounges in the basement enable students to have study groups and a 24-hour computer lab allows students to work at any time of day.



UPPERCLASS HOUSING

The majority of our upperclass residence halls serve as the perimeter of the campus community. Students can choose from single, double, triple or quad rooms as well as suite-style housing for 6 students. Each upperclass house offers a unique living environment and takes on its own personality based on its residents. We also offer a limited

number of apartments housing 1-6 residents who are looking for a more independent living arrangement. Typically, the majority of students residing in the apartments are seniors as they prepare for their transition post-graduation. While apartment residents do not have an RA, they do have a resource in one of our professional staff.






RESIDENCE LIFE STAFF

Resident Assistants (RAs) are graduate and undergraduate students responsible for fostering an atmosphere of academic, social, and personal growth in the residence halls campus-wide. They are supervised by full-time, administrative professionals who live in the residence halls. RAs help create a community here by coordinating programs that help you meet the people you live with. Your RA is always there to answer questions about classes, social and cultural activities, and anxiety about being away from home. A professional staff member supports the apartment residents to provide them with a sense of independence.

SAFETY AND SECURITY

The College of Saint Rose is concerned about the safety of all members of the campus community and their guests and

visitors. To ensure a safe and secure environment, we offer the following services:





- * Residence halls and apartments equipped with sprinkler systems, fire alarms and smoke detectors that directly connect with security
- * Locked residence hall doors accessible only to residents of that building
- * Residence Life staff live in the residence halls and are on-call 24 hours a day, seven days a week
- Send Word Now Emergency Notification System distributes critical information to campus email accounts, on-campus phones, and cell phones
