Notes for Bryant & Stratton College - The College of Saint Rose Criminal Justice Agreement:

- 1) ENGL 101 and COMM 201 (6 credits) combine to come in as ENG 105 (4 credits) and GEL 001 (2 credits of general elective) to complete the L01 requirement.
- 2) 62 is the maximum number of credits allowed for transfer into The College of Saint Rose. All possible electives are listed in this agreement and the student, along with his/her advisor, should select the most appropriate courses to complete his/her degree while not unnecessarily exceeding the number of credits required for the A.A.S. degree.
- 3) Bryant & Stratton College requires both Psychology and Sociology for fulfillment of the A.A.S. Criminal Justice program. Either of these courses can be used to fulfill the L11 Liberal Education Requirement at The College of Saint Rose and the other can be applied to General Electives.
- 4) CRJU 260, COMM 150, ENGL 250, and INSM 180 are required by Bryant & Stratton College for the A.A.S. degree in Criminal Justice. These courses will transfer to The College of Saint Rose but will not fulfill a major requirement. The transferred credits for these courses will count towards the 122 credit total required for the B.S. degree.
- 5) 62 is the maximum number of credits allowed for transfer into The College of Saint Rose.
- 6) Bryant & Stratton College does not offer foreign language, art or music courses, or physical education courses therefore; the foreign language (L02) and artistic knowledge (L05) and physical education (L12) liberal education requirements will be completed at The College of Saint Rose.
- 7) To fulfill the liberal education (L09) requirement in science at The College of Saint Rose, the science course must include a lab. NSCI 1280 Ecology, which is required for Criminal Justice majors at Bryant & Stratton, will transfer to Saint Rose as SCI 001 Science Elective, since it does not have a lab component.
- 8) A letter grade of C- or higher in each course is required for transfer into The College of Saint Rose. Any completed coursework with a grade lower than a C- will not be transferred.
- 9) This document is valid until the time which either party changes their respective program. At which point review/revision will be required.
- 10) The College of Saint Rose Transfer Equivalency Database and/or catalog should be consulted to ensure that selected coursework will fulfill the appropriate Liberal Education Requirements as designated by the "L0" next to the course credits.
- 11) The Transfer Equivalency Database is the most current tool to utilize when determining the transferability of credits into The College of Saint Rose. The Transfer Equivalency Database can be accessed by visiting the link below:


